## FROM THE PRESIDENT GRAHAM BECKETT



Dear Friends,

There has of course been an even more dramatic event; the death of the world's longest serving Sovereign Queen Elizabeth II who was our Patron. On behalf of our branch of ROSL I attended Government House and signed the Condolence Book on behalf of us all; I am informed that the Government House books are to be bound into two volumes and are to be forwarded to Buckingham Palace.

On Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> September we lunched at the Naval and Military Club and enjoyed a talk by Nick Hughes on Restless Dance Theatre. This is a theatre company which works with people who have some form of disability. He has found from them, that you can expect the unexpected. The theatre gives them the chance to make art on the physical, the social, the emotional, the intellectual and the artistic side. This competition runs across the year with finals in August; and this year it was won by a student from University Senior College with second and third places being awarded to students from Prince Alfred College and St Peter's Girls School respectively. The executive feels that this is a worthwhile competition for us to become involved.

The Royal Presidents Dinner was sponsored this year by the Royal Commonwealth Society (SA Branch) and was held on 23<sup>rd</sup> September 2022 at St. Mark's College, North Adelaide. This is an annual event (COVID permitting) and gathers together those South Australian institutions incorporated under Royal Charter. Her Excellency the Honourable Frances Adamson the Governor of South Australia and Mr Rod Bunten attended as the official Guests. Patsy and I attended together with Kathryn Needs and Dr Kym Trigg from the executive. Next year's dinner will be sponsored by ROSL SA Inc. and planning is under way.

Patsy and I recently attended a concert by the Adelaide Youth Orchestra at the Elder Hall, I know I keep on about how good they are but that is because they are and because we support them.
